



Cale Warnecke (a parent, US), Akhil Maheshwari (a patient/physician developing medical-genetic facilities for patient welfare, US), and Pankaj Agrawal (US, a neonatologist with expertise in genetics) Talks 20-30 min each; followed by discussion.

Cohort B: Ethics of Neonatal Care

Key talks by Roya Huseynova (Saudi Arabia) and Mark Mercurio (online, USA): key considerations in medical ethics); and Clara Montanez (Metro-Bethesda Rotary - early detection of fetal anomalies and the impact on the family). Talks followed by extensive discussion. The board may include Fauzia Shah, Bhavesh Shah, Melvin Hardy, Md. Mozibur Rahman, Amit Upadhyay, Sherri Buddington, Marisa Nimrod, and others. The discussion will go beyond the traditional emphasis on continued management of infants with dismal prognosis. We also plan to discuss religious sensitivities, educational fears with artificial intelligence, social inclusion of certain racial and native communities, and families with same-gender parents. Infants born to parents facing dire financial challenges, in illegal immigrant families, and those born to parents suffering from substance dependence need attention. Talks followed by discussion and demonstrations.
